- Early Childhood Special Education Services
 - a. No Charge
 - b. Must meet eligibility requirements, then IEP is developed
 - c. Transportation provided
 - d. Do not need to be toilet trained.
 - Related Services
 - a. Related Services are provided to meet education needs and goals
 - b. Are supplementary to education program and are required for child to benefit from special education
- 14) Head Start 752-7409
- Therapy may be provided through the school system
 - A meal may be provided
 - Transportation is provided.
 - Children must meet the eligibility requirements. There is an application process.
